# **ACTOR'S CODE**

This "Actor's Code" can help avoid problems and conflicts by defining rules and expectations at the outset.

This 2-page CODE, designed to be doubled-sided (8½" X 11"), can be:

- > included in an actor's packet;
- > assigned for brief discussion as part of theatre awareness/ education;
- > reviewed in segments at rehearsals;
- posted in the green-room; and
- > so forth.

Topics in the Code include care of script, costume, & props; stage manners; Do's & Don'ts, etc.

If certain parts of the Code do not meet your theatre's needs, white-out those parts before copying (except for source  $\delta$   $\circ$  info).

Every theatre group that has accessed these forms can make copies as needed for their use. Please encourage other groups or persons (if they want a copy) to download from **https://www.zanthymhouse.ca** so ZH can keep current with stats and analytics, and so others can be encouraged to participate in the gift-economy.

### THE ACTOR'S CODE



#### **BE ON TIME**

- Calendar for all rehearsals & performance dates
- Arrive with enough time to settle in & be ready at the appointed time. Then, be readily available as needed
- Notify the Stage Manager ASAP of any time problems



#### **DIRECTION**



- You take direction from the Director(s) ONLY 
   AGAP\*
- You get other information from the Stage Manager
- Do not give direction to others
- Trust the Directors' overall vision
- If you have concerns or ideas talk to the Director(s) [privately, if necessary]

\*AGAP = as gracefully as possible



#### FOCUS + CONCENTRATION + FOCUS

- Memorize your lines ASAP
- Learn your business
- Study your character to determine your motivation for action and movement
- Watch others being rehearsed & learn from their experience
- LISTEN & PRACTICE MINDFULNESS
- Respect the focus of others
- TRICKS & SURPRISES are never appropriate

# STAGE MANNERS

- The actor's job is to understand & interpret lines, not to invent them
- Pay attention & BE on cue
- Project, PROJECT, enunciate, ENUNCIATE
- Do not upstage others. Every performance is a team effort
- Keep still onstage unless you have something definite to do



#### **SCRIPT**

- Treat your script with tender care
- Write down ALL YOUR BLOCKING in soft lead pencil
- On the final night of performance, turn your script in, clean



#### **COSTUME**

- Wear the costumes provided, in the manner directed
- Treat costumes with respect. Keep them clean & hang them up in the place assigned
- Never wear logo-ed or patterned items under a costume (they can show thru under strong theatre lighting)
- Never wear costumes outside the designated theatre area
- Give the Costume Mistress advance notice about repairs

	<ul> <li>HAND PROPS</li> <li>Make sure you have the needed prop(s) for each scene BEFORE you make your entrance</li> <li>After use, return your props to the designated area. Do not carry props off to strange or unexpected places</li> <li>Do not touch the props of others</li> </ul>
DO'S	RESPECT & COURTESY DO:
DON'TS	<ul> <li>behave off-stage as you would have others behave when you are on-stage. In other words, THE GOLDEN RULE</li> <li>BE KIND, PATIENT, &amp; FORGIVING</li> <li>during the performance run, report in as soon as you arrive</li> <li>cooperate with the backstage crew &amp; respect their vital contribution to the success of the play</li> <li>take care with &amp; be respectful of all sets, props, costumes, wigs, make-up, etc.</li> <li>help keep the premises clean &amp; tidy</li> <li>keep to the green-room until your call to the wings</li> <li>be WHERE you need to be WHEN you need to be there</li> <li>help strike-the-set and clean-up at the end of the run</li> <li>cheerfully work as a team member in all that is required</li> <li>DON'T:</li> <li>criticize other's performances</li> <li>interfere with another's focus or concentration</li> <li>distract or talk to the prompter</li> <li>be temperamental</li> <li>make others wait on you</li> <li>chew gum on stage</li> <li>mess with stage &amp; design props or sets</li> <li>mess with or borrow the belongings, props, costumes, wigs, make-up, etc., of others</li> <li>bring or invite friends or family members to rehearsals or backstage during a performance (including the green-room)</li> </ul>
