- ▼ This Hymn-Sing can be used in any non-profit setting or family Christmas gathering. Two of the scripture readings are from the Book of Mormon.
- ▼ The hymns are intended to be sung by the audience / congregation or family group to maximize their participation. If the program needs to be shorter than 35-40 minutes, fewer verses of the hymns can be sung.
- ▼ The readings can be done by various assigned persons.
- ▼ The story & poetry references are from the *Ensign* magazine of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (aka: LDS or Mormon). The web sources are included.
- ♥ The Hymn #s are from the 1985 LDS Hymn Book.
- ▼ It is recommended that a printed outline of the program be handed out so the audience can anticipate the hymn singing.
- ▼ In the readings, please remember to reference the title & author of the story / poem / scripture.

A Most Beautiful Gift

Nephi: And it came to pass that I looked and beheld the great city of Jerusalem, and also other cities. And I beheld the city of Nazareth; and in the city of Nazareth I beheld a virgin, and she was exceedingly fair and white. And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men.
